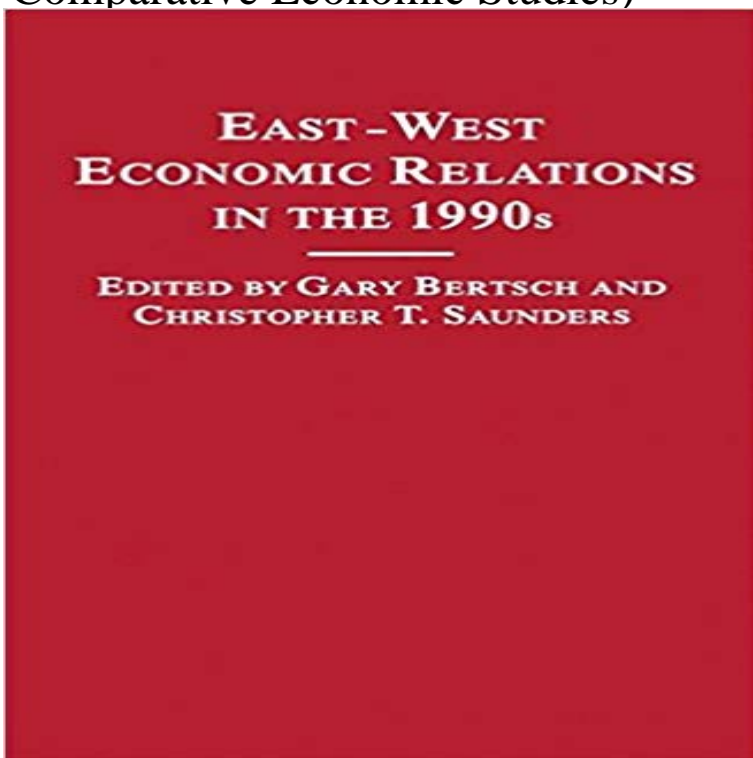


East-West Economic Relations in the 1990s (Vienna Institute for Comparative Economic Studies)
